

## The 6 global competencies

Some examples based on Michael Fullan\*:

### Character:

- Learning to learn, and ability to regulate your own process of learning
- Ability to say 'no', and claim your own values
- Work goal-directed
- Endurance
- Resistant, endurance
- Self-regulated in work and social behaviour

### Citizenship:

- Thinking as global citizens
- To explore global problem (using deep understanding and different values and worldviews)
- Genuine interests and abilities to solve complex real world problems which affects sustainability
- Empathy and ability to care for others

### Collaboration:

- To cooperate in teams
- Interpersonal abilities and team-related abilities
- Social, emotional and intercultural abilities
- To learn from others and contribute to other people's learning

### Communication:

- Ability to communicate in a purposeful way using a variability of methods
- Ability to communicate with digital tools
- Ability to adapt the communication to different groups
- Ability to reflect upon and improve better communication

### Creativity

- To have an "entrepreneurship" within the possibilities you are given
- To make relevant and exploring questions
- To consider and follow-up new ideas and solutions
- Ability to do something with your ideas

### Critical thinking

- Ability to evaluate information and arguments
- Ability to see connections and patterns
- Ability to solve problems
- Ability to make meaningful knowledge
- Ability to explore, reflect upon and follow up ideas in real life
